




What Happens when I Make a Safe2Say Report

1 You see a safety concern and make a report to Safe2Say via mobile app, phone (1-844-3SD-SAFE), or online at safe2say.sd.gov.


2 A person who analyzes the report for Safe2Say may ask you follow up questions to learn additional helpful information.

3 Once the information is collected, it is sent to the team at the impacted school district. You remain anonymous and your information is not collected by Safe2Say.

4 The local team, typically made up of school district employees and law enforcement, may also include mental health professionals.

5 That team will decide the response to a Safe2Say report, whether it's about someone who needs mental health supports or there is a threat posed to the school or community.

6 Teams then report back to Safe2Say with a disposition. The most common results of a report include mental health supports, parent notification, or check-ins that are made to make sure individuals are supported.
